One of Scouting's biggest benefits is the structured exposure to skills and practical knowledge that can help boys mature in family life, at school and in the community.

The youngest Scouts can earn recognition for achievement in Family, Den, or Go-See-It activities. They participate in all scouting events with an Adult Partner (usually Mom or Dad).

As Scouts grow, they can learn essential skills and enjoyment of outdoor activities, community involvement, personal safety, sports, and the environment. They earn emblems of recognition as they progress throughout the Cub Scout achievements and electives for their age group. All Scouts can also earn recognition for 24 different sports accomplishments including virtually every ball sport plus skating, fishing and swimming.

Academic accomplishment is also very important with recognition of accomplishment in 16 areas including:

Art – Astronomy – Chess – Computers – Geography – Heritage – Language and Cultures

Map and Compass – Mathematics – Music – Science – Weather – Wildlife Conservation

Webelos are the oldest Scouts and can earn 20 pins signifying their proficiency in Physical, Mental, Community, Technology, and Outdoor activities. The Webelos program also prepares boys to join Boy Scouts.

Camp Adventures:

Pack 1372 Cub Scouts have many opportunities to enjoy camping and the great outdoors. Our pack camps as a group two times a year (Fall and Spring). It is "family camping" where the whole family is encouraged to participate.

During the summer, Day Camp provides four packed days of fun-filled games, crafts, archery, and activities. For our older cubs there is a full week of scout camp complete with flag ceremonies, rifle range, swimming, boating, nature lodge, water fights, service project and much more.

Not day care – You should attend the meetings and events and be with your son. Cub Scouting is generally not a drop-your-son-off activity. Our activities are parent / son oriented. Parents provide our pack and den leadership, and everyone is expected to do their part to help run pack and den activities.

Other Pack 1372 Activities:

Pinewood Derby – Cubs build and decorate pinewood cars and race them down a track, a classic event that's fun for all.

Raingutter Regatta & Space Derby - Other scouting races where boys create boats, or rocket ships to race.

Service Projects – Each Fall cubs participate in BSAs national charity food drive, Scouting for Food. Cubs have also helped SERVE pack backpacks for needy kids and our pack will also be making a Sunday meal for SERVE.

Blue & Gold - Annual scouting banquet to celebrate the birthday of BSA and where 5th graders crossover into Boy Scouts.
